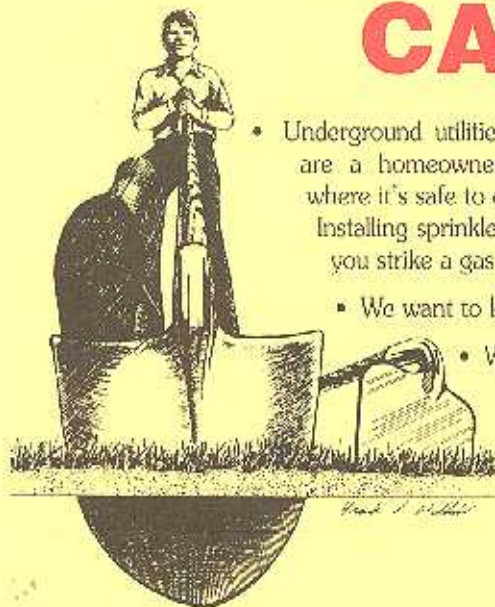


CALL FIRST



- Underground utilities exist everywhere, even in your yard. Whether you are a homeowner or excavation contractor, digging without knowing where it's safe to dig can cause tremendous damage and even loss of lives. Installing sprinklers or even planting a tree can be extremely dangerous if you strike a gas line.
 - We want to keep things safe for you and your neighbors.
 - We will be come to your excavation site within two (2) business days of your request to mark underground Intermountain Gas lines with yellow paint or stakes... and it's free.
 - Once marked, it is a good practice to carefully expose the line(s), by hand digging, to pinpoint their location.

NATURAL GAS LINE
